

YOUTH SKI LEAGUE (YSL) DIRECTOR

Mt. Spokane Ski Race Team ("MSSRT") seeks a YSL director. This is a great opportunity for a coach who desires to grow their coaching career in a supportive and collaborative environment.

MSSRT is a nonprofit ski program for youth in the Inland Northwest that aims to inspire and develop ski race athletes at all levels to their highest potential. YSL Director is a seasonal position typically starting in early fall until April 1st.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

- Implement the club's mission and Club Development Directors coaching strategies to the U12 and younger athletes while providing enthusiasm, engagement and a fun and successful environment to the racers and coaching staff alike.
- Assists in hiring, managing, and supervising qualified coaching for the YSL program.
- Work with athletes on hill and when possible, dryland environments as well as film study to ensure the goals of the organization and athletes are being achieved.
- Goal setting and evaluations with athletes at regular intervals.
- Plan, implement and manage athlete's training and away race travel.
- Coaching will range from two to four days per week.
- Assist Development Director with budgeting, coach per-diem for away races and reporting those finances.
- Travel to away races will be necessary for approximately 3 to 5 weekends per season for coaching and mentoring coaching staff.
- The YSL Director reports to the Board of Directors and the Development Director to collaborate on supporting MSSRT's mission and objectives.
- May include collaboration with mountain management.
- Communicate with families via TeamSnap platform regularly for scheduling and updates.

- Attend team events directed by Development Director.
- Supports MSSRT sponsorship efforts and fundraising events.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Works autonomously in competition and training environments
- Basic computer skills for reporting financials to Development Director
- Social and Communicative skills
- Minimum 3 years of experience in snowsport instruction and competitions
- Level 100 USSA / Level I PSIA or higher recommended.
- Safe Sport Certified
- Ability to ski expert level ski runs and courses
- Ability to stand for extended periods of time (up to 8 hours).
- Ability to regularly ascend several hundred vertical feet of mountainous terrain
- Ability to participate in calisthenics with athletes
- Ability to carry/lift fifty pounds.
- Valid Drivers license with good driving record (must be insurable)
- Enthusiasm and passion for kids, coaching, families and the sport of Ski Racing!

COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

- \$30,000 to \$40,000 seasonally D.O.E.
- Workman's compensation insurance and liability insurance
- Annual professional development/travel budget to be approved by Board of Director'
