RACE ANNOUNCEMENT

ENTRY FEE

All athletes and coaches need to register on AdminSkiRacing.com for U16 Western Region Championships. Entry fee is \$60 for Super G and \$55 for Giant Slalom or Slalom per race. No on-site registration. Signed waivers are required and must be completed when registering.

The total cost of entries for the athlete is \$230.



Only U.S. Ski and Snowboard officials working the race and registered athletes are allowed in the race venue.

Palisades Tahoe sees more than 300 sunny days per year.

Tahoe City is on the North Shore of Lake Tahoe, just 15 minutes from Palisades Tahoe. Enjoy dining, coffee shops and shopping galleries on beautiful Lake Tahoe. Lake Tahoe is the largest alpine lake in North America and the deepest point is 1,645 feet. Take Highway 89 south from Palisades Tahoe.

Historic downtown Truckee offers dozens of independently owned shops and eateries. There are local artists and galleries, live-entertainment and one-of-a-kind gifts. Truckee is just 20 minutes away from Palisades Tahoe. Take Highway 89 north to Truckee.

Reno is famous for its casinos and many restaurants (You must be 21 years old to gamble). It also offers some excellent shopping. The Summit is an outdoor mall and Meadow Wood Mall is an indoor mall. Take Highway 80 east 36 miles or 58 kilometers.

Winter is a special time to visit the Yosemite National Park. Yosemite Valley and Wawona are open to cars. The Tioga Road is closed during the winter. Yosemite National Park has many things to see—waterfalls, wildlife and Half Dome. The park is 3 hours and 20 minutes away from Palisades Tahoe.
